## ABOUT THE COMMON LAW ADMISSION TEST, 2012

The Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) is an all India entrance examination conducted by 14 National Law Schools/Universities for admissions to their under-graduate and post graduate degree programmes (LL.B \& LL.M). The 14 participating NLUs in the order of their establishment are:

1. National Law School of India University, Bangalore (NLSIU).
2. National Academy of Legal Study \& Research (NALSAR) University of Law, Hyderabad.
3. National Law Institute University, Bhopal (NLIU).
4. The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata (WBNUJS).
5. National Law University, Jodhpur (NLUJ).
6. Hidayatullah National Law University, Raipur (HNLU).
7. Gujarat National Law University, Gandhinagar (GNLU).
8. Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow (RMLNLU).
9. Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab (RGNUL).
10. Chanakya National Law University, Patna (CNLU).
11. National University of Advanced Legal Studies, Kochi (NUALS).
12. National Law University, Orissa (NLUO).
13. National University of Study $\&$ Research in Law, Ranchi (NUSRL).
14. National Law University \& Judicial Academy, Assam (NLUJA)

The first CLAT Core Committee (consisting of Vice-Chancellors of the participating institutes) decided that the test should be conducted by rotation in the order of their establishment. Accordingly CLAT-2008 (NLSIU, Bangalore), CLAT-2009 (NALSAR, Hyderabad), CLAT-2010 (NLIU, Bhopal) and CLAT 2011 (WBNJUJS, Kolkata) were conducted. The CLAT-2012 is being conducted by National Law University, Jodhpur (NLU, Jodhpur).

## General Information

1. Information regarding details of intake, reservation, courses offered along with the fee structure and further details is available on the CLAT Information Brochure 2012, CLAT2012 website or website of the concerned University.
2. Definition of disability for the purpose of admission shall be in accordance with Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995. Disability in the act is defined to include: Blindness, low vision, leprosy cured, hearing impairment, loco-motor disability, mental disability or illness. A candidate will have to produce disability certificate from competent authority in accordance with the provisions of the Act at the time of admission.
3. For details relating to the definition of NRI/NRI sponsored candidates and number of seats available for them, kindly
see the information provided by different participating Universities.
4. Some of the Universities (e.g. CNLU, Patna) will admit the NRI candidates directly whereas others will do so through CLAT. Please read the information provided by the participating Universities on the subject in the CLAT Information Brochure or on the CLAT Website.
5. In the event of insufficient number of candidates appearing from a particular centre, the Convener CLAT-2012 reserves the right to cancel the centre and shift the applicants to another nearest centre.
6. Foreign nationals are not permitted to appear in CLAT2012. Those desirous of taking admission to any course in any of the participating Law Universities may directly contact the concerned University having seats for foreign nationals.
7. Any candidate who requires a scribe to write the test should intimate in writing to the Convener, CLAT-2012 at the time of submitting their application form and in any case, not less than two months prior to the CLAT-2012 entrance examination, citing reasonable cause and attaching relevant supporting documents.
8. There shall be a centralised admission process for CLAT2012 on the basis of merit cum preference. All admissions shall be centrally done at National Law University, Jodhpur. The information relating to date of admission shall be placed on CLAT website from time to time.

## THE UNDER-GRADUATE PROGRAMME OFFERED BY THE NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITIES

Ellglbillty:
To be eligible to appear in CLAT-2012, a candidate should have obtained a Senior Secondary School/Intermediate (10+2) or its equivalent qualification from a recognised Board with not less than $50 \%$ marks in aggregate ( $45 \%$ in case of SC/ST/OBC and PWD).* Candidates who have appeared in the $10+2$ examination and are awatting results are also eligible to appear in the test." Age of candidate should not be more than 20 years in case of General/OBC candidates (22 years in case of SC/ST and persons with Disability)- as on 1st July, 2012.

The different subject areas of the exam are explained as under:

1. English including Comprehension

The English section will test the candidate's proficiency in English based comprehension passages and grammar. In the comprehension section, candidates will be questioned on their understanding of the passage and its central theme, meanings of words used therein etc. The grammar section requires correction of incorrect grammatical sentences, filling of blanks in sentences with appropriate words, etc.
2. General Knowledge/Current Affairs

This section will only test students on their knowledge of current affairs (broadly defined as matters featuring in the mainstream media between March 2011 and March 2012)
3. Mathematics

This section will test candidates only on "elementary" mathematics i.e. maths that is taught up to the class $X$.
4. Logical Reasoning

The purpose of the logical reasoning section is to test the student's ability to identify patterns, logical links and rectify illogical arguments. It will include a wide variety of logical reasoning questions such as syllogisms, logical sequences, analogies, etc. However, visual reasoning will not be tested.
5. Legal Aptitude

This section will test students only on "legal aptitude". Questions will be framed with the help of legal propositions (described in the paper), and a set of facts to which the said proposition has to be applied. Some propositions may not be "true" in the real sense (e.g. the legal proposition might be that any person who speaks in a movie hall and disturbs others who are watching the movie will be banned from entering any movie theatre across India for one year). Candidates will have to assume the "truth" of these propositions and answer the questions accordingly.
Candidates will not be tested on any prior knowledge of law or legal concepts. If a technical/legal term is used in the question, that term will be explained in the question
itself. For example, if the word patent is used, the meaning of patent ("a legal monopoly granted by the government for certain kinds of inventions") will also be explained.

## PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING AND SUBMISSION OF THE APPLICATION FORMS:

## 1. Mode of obtaining Application form

i) Printed Application Forms along with the CLAT-2012 Information Brochure will be available at the designated branches (refer-www.clat.ac.in) of the State Bank of India, or in any of Law Schools mentioned above against payment of Rs.3000/- only (Rs.2500/in case of SC/ST/PWD on submission of proof) inclusive of test fee and bank charges.
ii) Request for Application Form may be sent to the Convener, CLAT-2012, National Law University, Jodhpur, NH-65, Nagour Road, Mandore, Jodhpur -342 304 (Raj.) with a demand-draft of Rs.3000/- only (Rs.2500/- in case of SC/ST/PWD) drawn in favour of the National Law University, Jodhpur CLAT AVC and payable at Jodhpur (Rajasthan).

ii) Candidates applying on downloaded application forms must also enclose Demand Draft/Bankers Cheque/ Pay order of Rs.3000/- (Rs.2500/- for SC/ST/PWD candidates) in favour of "National Law University, Jodhpur CLAT A/C" and payable at Jodhpur (Rajasthan).
iii) Candidates applying online should have a demand draft of Rs.3000/- (Rs.2500/- for SC/ST/PWD candidates) in favour of "National Law University, Jodhpur CLAT $A / C$ ' and payable at Jodhpur (Rajasthan) ready before starting the procedure.

Incomplete application or application received after the last date shall not be considered. University shall not be responsible for any postal/courier delay.

## DECLARATION OF RESULTS :

CLAT result will be published with merit lists prepared on the basis of overall merit, gender-wise, state-wise and reservation/ special category wise.

## MODE OF ADMISSION :

(A) Admission to LL.B. courses

The basic principle of admission to LL.B. Courses through CLAT will remain the same i.e. merit cum preference. The institute-wise preferences shall be obtained from the candidates in the application form itself. The first merit list of the candidates will be made available to the respective participating institute as per merit cum preference basis. This list (institute-wise allotment) will be published along with the declaration of the result itself and the candidates will be asked to deposit their full fees with the respective Law Schools/ Universities allotted to them. The eligibility criteria will be checked by the respective Law Schools/Universities at the time of admission.

In case a vacancy exists in any Law School/University after completion of the formalities related to First List, the second merit list will be declared including the list of reshuffled candidates. If any candidate who has deposited fee earlier is shifted to other Law Schools/Universities of higher preference; his/her total fees will be transferred accordingly and any difference in the fees shall be taken care of by the concerned Law School/ University where the candidate is finally allotted a seat.

All offers of admission by CLAT-2012 shall be provisional and shall not create any right to admission in favour of a candidate. CLAT-2012 will not be responsible for any expenditure incurred by the candidate on travel etc.
Under no circumstances shall change of University be allowed after a candidate is admitted to a University.
(B) Admission to LL.M. Courses

In case of admission to LL.M. Courses, admission will be finalized by the respective institutes on the basis of the score of the candidates in CLAT-2012. The CLAT-2012 will publish the general merit list and also category wise merit list. After the declaration of the results, the candidates shall be required to submit application for admission to institute(s) of his/her choice in the format to be made available on the CLAT website: www.clat.ac.in. Score card, information letter and application Proforma will be sent to individual student. The filled in application may be sent by either email or hardcopy within a period of 20 clear days from the date of declaration of the results. The lastdate will be notified on the CLAT website. There will be no application fee in this respect. The eligibility, reservations etc. will be determined and checked by the concerned institute. However, the relative merit of the candidates, within each category, will be determined solely on the basis of their score in CLAT-2012.

## National Law School of India University, Bangalore



NLSIU had a modest beginning in an old building at the Central College Campus of Bangalore University and was shifted to the present campus in 1991. Thereafter it has been a perlod of steady growth and we have now one of the best equipped and beautiful campuses. The Library, I.e. Shrl Narayana Rao Melgirl National Law Library is the best Law Library in the country. The entire campus including the hostels is provided with wireless connectivity and as a result, the students can access intemet services from anywhere In the Campus and NLSIU is the first Law School to achieve this distinction. All the class rooms are equipped with LCD Projectors and other facilities.
There are independent hostels for men and women and being a residential University, all the students have to stay in the Hostels. The Library is kept open till midnight in order to facilitate intensive use of acadernic resources.

There is a well-equipped moot court hall named after Justice M. Hidayatullah, former Chlef Justice of Indla. Every student of NLSIU is expected to participate actively in the moot court activities. Our students have kept the highest Mooting traditions of the NLSIU by excelling in National and International Moot Court Competitions. Our students have won the 1st BCIIntemational Law Moot, International Criminal Court Trial Moot Court Competition held at The Hague and 4th Monroe E Price Intemational Media Law Moot Court Competition,
In fact, one of the core ingredients of the NLSIU life is vibrant debating, mooting and conference culture. Some of the most
exciting competitions students take part In are client counseling and negotiation competitions, which promote the art of speaking without arguing. This goes a long way in making a successful lawyer. Another aspect of life at Law School is the Legal Services Clinic, which extends free legal aid and counseling and organises sensitisation workshops on social issues like dowry, child marriage and domestic violence in surrounding villages and schools. This activity along with various film festivals and street theatre help Imbibe a sense of social responsibility among students.
The National Law School of Indla Review, The Indian Joumal of Law and Technology, Socio-Legal Review and the Indian Journal of International Economics Law - these are the four prestiglous journals being published from the NLSIU. All of them are peer revlewed and have received rave review. All these joumals have been handled by the students only.
As part of the outreach programmes, NLSIU has renewed the earlier practice of interacting with the law colleges in India In an attempt to extend the academic support to them from time to time.
The NLSIU sustained its premier position at the top when it was placed at RANK 1 by THE WEEK, OUTLOOK AND HINDUSTAN TIMES. It was the ENCORE of "Hat-trick".
Mr. Gautam Bhatia, has been awarded the Rhodes Scholarship, a prestigious scholarship for the year 2011 and has also secured 11 Gold Medals at the 19th Annual Convocation held on 7th August, 2011. This year, i.e. 2012, Ms. Vrinda Bhandari, student of final

Two of our former students Mr. Cyrl Darlang Diengdoh and Mr. Ashutosh Salil, qualified themselves in the Civil Services Examination 2009 and got into the Indian Administrative Service. Three of our students got admission into prestigious Oxford University, i.e. Magdalen College, St. Hilda's College and Corpus Christi College. Mr. V. Niranjan, who has passed out of NLSIU in 2010 and who has secured 12 Gold Medals at the 18th Annual Convocation held on 29th August, 2010, has brought more laurels to NLSIU, Bangalore by topping the Oxford Post-graduates. A proud recipient of Rhodes Scholarship Mr. V. Niranjan has also bagged the prestigious Vinerlan Scholarship.
Varlous donors have established 14 Endowment Chairs in NLSIU to promote the study of different subjects. These subjects include Constitutional Law, Refugee Law, Corporate Law, International Trade Law, Alternate Dispute Resolution, Intellectual Property Law, Consumer Law, etc. Allen and Overy, a leading British Law firm, has set up the Chair on International Financial Laws and Prof. Philipp Wood, a leading authority on the subject, conducted week's intensive course along with the attorneys of the firm in NLSIU campus under the auspices of the Chair.
The NLSIU has a well-developed research centres in Juvenile Justice, Intellectual Property Rights, Environmental Law, Women and the Law, Child and the Law, Social Exclusion and Inclustive Policy.

## Course Structure

NLSIU follows a trimester system whereunder an academic year is divided into three parts and four subjects are taught in each trimester. As a result, a student would have completed sixty courses by the time he / she completes the five year term. The wide spread of subjects helps our students to acquire extensive and intensive knowledge of our legal system. All subjects are compulsory upto the end of fourth year and optional seminar courses are offered in the final year. These optional seminar courses provide opportunities to specialise in certain areas. For example, a student who wishes to pursue career in corporate
law may choose seminar courses on accountancy, securities law, mergers and acquisitions, etc. NLSIU encourages the involvement of outside expertise in offering seminar courses. In recent years, the seminar courses have been offered in subjects such as European Law, Telecommunication Law, Negotiation Skills, International Taxation, Media Law \& Ethics, etc. To find out the courses taught at NLSIU and their distribution over the years, please check NLSIU Website: www.nls.ac.in.
Another significant method of involving scholars from outside is by way of single credit courses. These courses normally comprise of 18 hour lectures spread over a week. This also facilitates the nation's otherwise busy leading professionals and academics from foreign Universities to teach at the Law School. These are intensive courses and focus on highly specialised areas of Law. Some of the single credit courses offered at NLSIU during the past couple of years include International Climate Law $\mathbb{E}$ Litigation, Law, Economics and Religion : A Rational Choice Perspective, Selected Issues in the Philosophical Foundations of Criminal Law, International Commercial Arbitration, Constitutional Law of the European Union, etc.


## Eligiblity

To be eligible for admission, a candidate should have passed the Higher Secondary School/Intermediate Examination (10+2) or its equivalent examination with not less than $50 \%$ marks in aggregate ( $45 \%$ in case of SC/ST and persons with disability) in the first attempt and should be below 20 years of age as on 1st July 2012 (22 years in case of SC/ST and persons with disability).
Candidates appearing or awaiting result of the qualifying examination can also appear in the test on condition that they produce proof of having passed the qualifying exam at the time of formal interviews.

Those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks are not eliglble for admission. Candidates whose marks statement of the qualifying examination is not available at the time of formal interviews, are not eligible for admission.
The University reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate in accordance with the Rules.

## POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMME

LL.M. (Master of Laws) DEGREE PROGRAMME
NLSIU offers two-year LL.M. Degree programme in two distinct and separate Branches of specialization: (1)BUSINESS LAWS and (ii) HUMAN RIGHTS LAWS with an intake limited to 25 seats in

## Course Structure

## Courses

1. B.A.L.B. (Hons.)
B.A.LL.B (Hons.) course is of five years duration with a trimester system. There are three trimesters in a year and each trimester is of three months duration. In each trimester students are taught four core courses and at least two skill courses like Computer, English, Legal Writing, Accountancy, Research Methodology etc. In the final year in addition to the compulsory courses students have to choose from a number of optional courses. (Please refer to the Table-I on next page). NLIU follows a system of continuous evaluation. In each trimester a student has to undertake a mid term examination an end term examination and a project work (written and presentation) in each paper and a viva-voce examination.
2 L.M
L.M. course is of two years duration and is divided into four semesters. University offers specialization in Human Rights, Intellectual Property a Business Law, Consttutional and Administrative Law, Business Law and Criminal Law. Allocation of L.M. subject specializations will be done at the time of admission on the basis of merlt. Aspecialization will be offered subject to the availability of faculty and sufficient number of students opting for it. A student in each semester has to undertake an end semester examination and a project work in each paper, which includes written submissions and presentation. In the final semester the student has to submit a dissertation and undertake a viva-voce examination. For the list of subjects visit University website.
3 Nan Credit Courses
The University also offers to its B.A.LL.B (Hons.) and LL.M. students non-credit courses such as Competition Law, Comparative Jurisprudence, International Commercial Arbitration, Global Terrorism, Cyber Law, Law and Economics, Maritime Law, etc.
4 Post Graduate Diploma through Regular Mode Post Graduate Diploma courser through regular mode are offered in the area of Cyber Law, Environment Law and Science and Technology.

Ph.D course is of two years duration. Admission to Ph.D. programme is through an entrance test conducted by the University.

# The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata 

## About the University

The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS) was established under the WBNUJS Act 1999 (West Bengal Act IX of 1999). It is a university within the meaning of sub-section(f) of section 2 and section 12-B of the UGC Act, 1956 and has permanent affiliation from the Bar Council of India. The Chief Justice of India is the Chancellor of the University and Chairman of its highest governing body - the General Council.
In its relatively short existence, NUJS has firmly established itself as one of the premier national law school of India. It has gone on to be ranked amongst the top three law schools in India by leading publications such as Outlook India, Mint and LexisNexis Halsbury's Law Monthly.

## Location and Infrastructure:

NUJS is located in the city of Kolkata, a major metropolis of India. Kolkata, the City of Joy, is renowned for its heritage and culture. A subtle blend of tradition and modernity distinguishes the city. The old Kolkata thrives alongside the growing expanses of modern townships, including Salt Lake City, where the NUJS campus is situated.
The campus itself has one academic and three residential blocks (i.e. two seven-storied halls of residence for girls and boys each and a two-storied staff accommodation quarters cum Guest House). The academic block, named after Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, is a four-storied majestic edifice in stone, having 105 rooms in all. NUJS has everything a modern university ought to have - small and big class rooms, seminar halls, conference rooms, and an air-conditioned auditorium with a seating capacity of approximately six hundred for special and endowment lectures, conferences, convocation, cultural and other activities. The highlight of NUJS is a well-stocked, wi-fied, air-conditioned library with access to over 12,000 volumes on law, economics, politics, etc., national and international journals and all major online internet resources for law and other related social science subjects, as well as the facility to download, print and photocopy any materials. The NUJS campus also includes a bank, a canteen, state-of the-art kitchens at the hostels, health care, sports facilities including a gym and various other recreational facilities. All student hostels are wired with Internet access and ERNET is currently upgrading the university network to provide for a WiFi campus. The UGC has also sanctioned a computer centre for the University, work on which will begin soon.

## Legal Education:

NUJS strives to offer the best in legal education in order to prepare its graduates for the diverse spheres of litigation, corporate legal practice, legal academia, legal research, social service and public leadership. It offers various academic programmes including the popular five-year integrated B.A./B.Sc. LL.B (Hons.), two-year LL.M, M.Phil, Ph.D and LL.D degree programmes. It also offers several diploma and certificate programmes through distant, contact and regular classroom instructions. A one-year LL.M programme and a two-year double
degree programme (LL.M/M.A) in Law and Public Policy are also in the offing.
Students learn through a discussion-based, interactive classroom experience and a rigorous socratic methodology encourages critical thinking. The academic year is divided into two semesters of equal duration followed by examination at the end of each semester. In each semester and in each course, every student undergoes rigorous training and skills learning through projects, viva voce, moot court participation and several other intensive activities. The courses combine purely legal subjects with social sciences, to provide our students with a holistic appreciation of law and its interaction with the society from a multi-disciplinary perspective. The courses also include a range of elective subjects as diverse as Corporate Finance, International Commercial Arbitration, Securities Law, Judicial Review, Competition Law, International Human Rights Law, Sports Law and Law and Economics, which give students the opportunity to specialize in their preferred areas of study. In principle only foundational courses are compulsory while all the rest are electives. Grading of results is done on a seven-point scale.

At the end of each semester, every student interns with a diverse range of organizations including law firms, senior counsel offices, in-house legal teams, NGOs, research and policy think tanks, etc.

The students are also encouraged to participate in serious research and writing, and learning editorial skills through the medium of two law journals, NUJS Law Review and Journal of Indian Law and Society of which the former is a quarterly publication while the latter appears bi-annually. NUJS Law Review has also been ranked as the number one academic law journal of India for the year 2008 and 2009 by the Washington and Lee University School of Law ranking of law journals.

## All Round Education:

NUJS has a diverse and vibrant student community from all over India, including several foreign nationals. While the key focus is on academics, NUJS also has a highly developed sports and cultural programme, with teams regularly excelling at various national level competitions. Student societies of NUJS organize 4 major annual events - the literary-cum-cultural extravaganza, Outlawed, Invicta (national sports fest), the NUJS-Herbert Smith National Corporate Law Moot Court Competition, and the NUJS Parliamentary Debate. These events attract enormous participation from the best law schools in the country.

Student societies also conduct popular year-round competitions in music, dance, painting, quizzing, debating, creative writing and sports. NUJS holds tournaments not just in mainstream sports such as cricket, football and volleyball, but even sports like dodge-ball and kabaddi. Adding colour to life at NUJS are the western and eastern music bands, which have proved their mettle at competitions all across the country. NUJS also has a vibrant SPICMACAY chapter, and has hosted performers like Pt. Hariprasad

Chaurasia, Pt. Shivkumar Sharma and Smt. Shovana Narain. Writer's Block, the college magazine, contains campus news, and contributions in prose and poetry, giving students with literary inclinations the chance to showcase their skills.

Nor do NUJS students neglect their social responsibilities. The Legal Aid Society provides a platform for students to apply the skills and knowledge acquired in the classroom and meaningfully contribute to the community. The Society takes up legal causes of indigent people either independently or in association with other organizations, assists other law schools in setting up their legal aid clinics and programmes, organizes legal awareness camps and street plays in uban and rural areas, and conducts adult education and legal awareness courses for mess, housekeeping, security and other supporting staff of NUJS. NUJS recently assisted the North Eastern Hill University (Shillong) to set up and operationalize its Legal Aid Clinic. It also recently partnered with the Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative (CHRI) to launch SHADHINOTA, a project aimed at bringing justice and legal empowerment to inmates of correctional homes across West Bengal. NUJS believes that it is only such holistic legal education that can create the well-rounded leaders of tomorrow.
NUJS has an enviable track record in moot court competitions. NUJS students emerged as the first Indian and only the second Asian team to win the prestigious Willem C. Vis International Commercial Abitration Moot, Vienna. They are also the proud winners of the 2010 edition of the ELSAMoot Court Competition, held in Dominican Republic. NUJS students have performed admirably in Willem C. Vis (East) International Commercial Arbitration Moot, Hong Kong and the Stetson International Environment Moot, Florida, not to mention virtually every national moot court competition of note. Students attend and even present papers at conferences all over the wortd, and have regular publications in peer-reviewed journals of international repute.
With such a comprehensive programme, it is scarcely surprising that in the short span of the University's existence, NUJS alumni have distinguished themselves in a range of careers, not only on the national but also on the international stage. The student recruitment committee at NUJS boasts of a near 100\% recruitment success rate. Graduating students join leading law firms and companies in India and abroad, clerk with judges at the Supreme Court, and work towards the betterment of society with prestigious NGOs. Many are upcoming litigators at the Supreme Court and various High Courts. Each year an increasing number of NUJS students gain admission to prestigious universities in U.K. like Oxford and Cambridge, and Ivy League universities of the U.S. such as Harvard and NYU. Many of them have been awarded prestigious scholarships like Rhodes and INLAKS to pursue higher studies.

## Faculty:

NUJS has an excellent faculty with a good mix of young and experienced scholars. The faculty includes Rhodes, Fulbright, Commonwealth and Chevening scholars, and alumni from universities including Columbia University, Oxford University, University of Michigan, SOAS, University of Vanderbilt, London School of Economics, NUS, University of Liverpool and Max Planck. Faculty members have publications in prestigious international
journals such as Journal of the World Intellectual Property, and the Journal of International Abitration, to name a few and a host of Indian journals.
Many scholars of international repute from within and outside the country, including luminaries like Amartya Sen, Joseph Stiglitz, Mark Tushnet, Philippe Cullet and Prof. Timothy Endicott visit the University to deliver special lectures and offer short as well as regular courses on diverse subjects. The University has also entered into memorandum of understanding with several premier institutions across the globe for academic exchange of students and faculty such as the prestigeous University of Freiburg, Germany. It also has several endowment chairs held by eminent scholars. The University has also instituted the Ford Foundation Chair on Human Rights and the MHRD Chair on Intellectual Property Rights.

## Fees:

Despite being able to achieve a high level of academic ambience, NUJS has maintained a relatively modest fee structure, It further seeks to ensure that no student is forced to discontinue studies on account of financial constraints. With generous donations of individuals and institutions, the University has built up a Scholarship Fund, proceeds of which are disbursed to students every year on a "need" basis. The alumni of NUJS have also instituted a scholarship. Arrangements are in place for students of NUJS to secure educational loans from any Bank of their choice on mutually agreeable terms.

## Scholarships, Diversity and IDIA:

NUJS aims to reach out to potential candidates across the length and breadth of India and provide high quality education to those hailing from the most marginalized and poorest sections of society. All efforts will be made to provide free or subsidized education to such students. NUJS offers scholarship to 10\% students on need-cum-merit basis.

In keeping with its vision of increasing access to legal education to the marginalized sections, NUJS is one of the forerunners of the Increasing Diversity by Increasing Access (IDIA) project, of which details can be found at <www.idialaw.com>. This project has faculty and student volunteers from across the various national law schools visiting underprivileged communities in various parts of India, identifying students from such communities with legal aptitude and offering them free training for CLAT.

## Towards Creating Leaders and Social Engineers:

NUJS perceives legal education as a potent instrument that will help bring about improved sacial order contributing in turn to national development.
Globalisation has thrown up new challenges and newer issues of concern. NUJS students are expected to adequately arm themselves to combat these challenges in mission mode. The standards set in NUJS are already very high. Those who join NUJS are expected not only to sustain, but also to improve upon these standards. NUJS promises the best return on their dedication, hard labour and committed efforts. In all, the NUJS experience will enable students to think out of the box and equip them with skills necessary to transform them into the social engineers and leaders of tomorrow.

# Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow 

## 1. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Universtty, was established by an Act of the Legislature of Uttar Pradesh in 2005 (U.P. Act No. 28 of 2005) which came into force on 4th of January 2006. The University became functional since July, 2006. The University has been established to advance and disseminate leaming and knowledge of law and legal process and to develop in the students and research scholars a sense of responsibllity to serve the saclety. Dr. Ram Manohar Lohłya National Law University, which is fully funded by the State Govermment of Uttar Pradesh, provides excellent infrastructural facilities and academic environment to the students. The fully residential University is a complete township and has separate hostels for boys and girl students along with the mess facilities. The University Library, Hostels etc. are provided with the Wi-Fi connectivity to the Internet. The University has a World class Noot Court Hall, where the mooting and debate compettions are organized which attracts participants from all over Indla. There is a rigorous internship program which every student of the University has to undergo as a part of the curralum during vacation period. The University has a 3000 capacity state- of -the art auditorium which is the biggest auditorium with any of the University in India. The Untversity also has a well equipped seminar hall and video conferencing hall, wherein seminars/workshops/ interactive sessions are conducted on regular intervals. A well equipped gymnasium and indoor 4 outdoor games faclltlies are also available for students. The newly constructed swimming pool is likely to be made functional shortly. Located in the South-West part of Lucknow City, the University has forty acres of sprawing green campus in LDA's Kanpur Road Scheme. The University is situated in the heart of the city. The distance from Amausi airport is three kilometers and nearly seven klometers from Lucknow rallway station. Sanjay Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sclences and Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University are the other neighboring educational Institutlons. The District Court, High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench and Vidhan Sabha are all in the radius of ten kilometers.
The Uriversity offers five year B.A. L.B.(Hans.) Program and two year LL.ML Program. The University follows a semester system. The Unlversity, in order to develop a doser link between the teacher and taught, has introduced the Mentorship Program. There are various Committees, having students as its members, wherein the students decide the functions, events and other activities. In order to provide transparency in the examination system, the students are shown their answer sheets for any change in the award already given.

2. B.A. LL.B. (HONS.) PROGRAMME

The adrrission shall be based on the performance in the Common Law Admission Test-2012. However, to qualify for admission, the candidate:

(a) must have passed the Higher Secondary School Examination (10+2) or an examination equivalent thereof, securing in aggnegate not less than 50\% ( $45 \%$ in case of SC/ST candidates of U.P.) of the total marks.
(b) must not have completed 20 years ( 22 years in case of SC/ST candidater of U.P.\} of age as on 1st July, 2012.
The Candidates, who have appeared in the qualifying examination and awaiting for their results, may also write the Admission Test but their admission shall be subject to the fulfillment of the requirements in (a) and (b) above at the time of admission.

## Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab

## ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law (RGNUL), Punjab was established by the State Legislature of Punjab by passing the Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law Punjab Act, 2006 (Punjab Act No. 12 of 2006). RGNUL started functioning from its Headquarters - Mohindra Kothi, the Mall, Patiala w.e.f. 26 May 2006. The University acquired approval of the Bar Council of India (BCI) in August 2006. The University got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 also got recognition under Section 12-B of the said Act. The RGNUL is also member of Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi and several other prestigious national and international institutions/organizations.
Presently, RGNUL is carrying on academic as well as administrative activities from a heritage building of the erstwhile Patiala State, that is, Mohindra Kothi, located in the heart of Patiala city in a pollution free environment. Keeping in view the requirements of a National University of Law, necessary infrastructure has been developed at this location in the form of classrooms, lecture halls, computer labs, library, reading hall, health centre, gymnasium and other facilities. There are separate buildings as Administrative Block, Academic Block, Library, Guest House, Mess Hall, Canteen, etc.
The main campus of the University is coming up at Sidhuwal, Bhadson Road, Patiala in an area of 50 Acres of land. A state-of-the-art Campus will have an Administrative-cum-Academic Block, separate spacious Library Building, Auditorium, Sports Complex, Boys and Girls Hostels, Guest House, Community Hall, Health Centre, Residences, Stadium and other facilities. The construction and furnishing of Hostels is complete and all RGNUL Boys and Girls students are residing at the new Campus with modem amenities including air conditioning of each room.
RGNUL has a well equipped computerized Central Library with twenty two thousand titles and about two thousand other academic documents in addition to the specialized librarles of our various Research Centres. There are two advanced Computer Labs with 60 computers and leased line internet connectivity. The whole RGNUL Campus is wi-fi enabled which is also extended to the respective hostels round the clock.
The University has also set up Centres of Advanced Study at its campus. These are: Centre for Advanced Study in Criminal Law (CASCL); Centre for Consumer Protection Law and Advocacy (CCPLA); Centre for Advanced Study in Intemational Humanitarian Law (CASH); School of Agricultural Law and Economics (SALE); RGNUL Institute of Competitive Examination (RICE), Centre for Advanced Study in Human Rights (CASHR) and Directorate of Distance Education (DODE).
The School of Law of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), New Delhi has set up a Programme Study Centre at RGNUL, Patiala. RGNUL Legal Aid Clinic has also been established at the RGNUL Campus under the aegis of Punjab State Legal Services Authority.

## B.A.LL.B. (HONS.) FIVE YEAR INTEGRATED COURSE

RGNUL offers B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Programme whereunder Social Sciences subjects like Economics, English, History, Political Science and Sociology are taught as major and minor subjects alongwith Law subjects in the first two years of study. From third year onwards, the curriculum comprises all law subjects. All subjects are compulsory in the first three years of study. However, in the fourth and fifth year, students are offered specializations in four streams, viz., Business Law, Criminal Law, Constitutional Law and International Law. The successful students are awarded Honours Degree with specialization.
RGNUL follows the Semester System. The teaching methodology includes extensive and intensive class room teaching with emphasis on participative learning. The Courses include assignments, seminars and project work. The thrust of the course is not just on learning but also professional training.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The Admission shall be based exclusively on the merit in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). However, to qualify for admission:

1. The candidate must have passed $10+2$ examination of the Punjab School Education Board or its equivalent with minimum 50\% marks in the aggregate ( $45 \%$ marks for SC/ST and Persons with disability).
2. The age of the candidate must not be more than 20 years in case of General and 22 years in case of the SC/ST and Persons with disability (PWD) as on 1 July 2012.
3. The candidates appearing in or awaiting results of the qualifying examination held or being held in March/April 2012 may also apply and appear for the Combined Law Admission Test (CLAT) provisionally, subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed percentage of marks at the time of their interview/counseling.
4. The candidature of:
(a) those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and/or fail to produce result on the date of interview/counseling, or
(b) those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination, shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.
Candidate applying in the SC/ST and Person with disability category is required to submit category certificate from the competent authority.

## ENTRANCE

Thus, on August 15th, 2006 came into being Chanakya National Law University (CNL) at Patna under the able guidance of its Vice-Chancellor/Pro-Chancellor, Prof. A. Lakshminath, former

Dean and Registrar, NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad. CNLU was established under the Chanakya National Law University Act, 2006 (Bihar Act No. 24 of 2006) and included in Section 2 (f) of the UGC Act, 1956 and is approved by the Bar Council of India. The University is presently functioning from its own Campus admeasuring 18 Acres of land situated in the heart of Patna with spacious Halls of Residence for Boys and Girls, state of the Art Library, Academic and Administrative Blocks with Intemet Centre having Wi-fi facility with dedicated lease line and committed Faculty.
The University has launched its B.A., LL.B (Hons.) 5 year integrated course in 2006. The University will start 1 year LL.M programme shortly subject to the approval of UGC. The unfversity has started Ph.D. and LL.D courses. It will soon start seven PG. Diploma courses of one academic year during this academic session. They include (1) P.G.Diploma in Human Rights; Humanitarian Law and Refugee Law, (2) P.G. Diploma in Industrial and Intellectual Property Law, (3) P.G. Diploma in Altemative Dispute Resolution, (4) P.G. Diplama in Cyber Laws, (5) P.G. Diploma in Disaster Management and Law, (6) P.G. Diploma in Disabilities and Law and (7) P.G. Diploma Course in Administrative Law and Public Administration.

Direct Admissions: Out of a maximum of 140 seats for B.A., Ш.B. (Hons.) Course 10 seats will be allotted to Foreign Nationals and 10 seats will be allotted to NRI's/NRI sponsored candidates. The

(Hall of Residencr for Boys)
unfilled seats in Foreign Nationals Category will be allotted to NRI's/NRI Sponsored Candidates. These categories of candidates are exempted from taking the Common Law Admission Test. However, they shall fulfill other requirements regarding age and qualifications as per CLAT-2012 and CNLU eligibility Regulations. Their merit list will be determined on the basis of their $10+2$ marks. If the merit is still the same then the marks of 10th standard will be taken into consideration. If still there is no change in rank then the higher in age shall get preference.
Candidates who wish to apply under Foreign Nationals Category/ NRI's/NRI sponsored category shall submit the duly filled in application forms which can be downloaded from our Website www.cnlu.ac.in with all supporting documents along with crossed DD for Rs. 5,000/- in favour of Registrar, Chanakya National Law University, Patna, payable at Patna on or before Wednesday the 06th June 2012. ## A. ELIGIBILITY

Candidates seeking admission to the B.A., LL.B (Hons) Course, should:
(a) As on July 1, 2012 the candidate must not have attained the age of
(i) Twenty (20) years for General/OBC Category Candidates, and
(ii) Twenty Two (22) years for SC/ST and persons with Disability Category Candidates (hereinafter referred to as 'PWD')
(b) Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination, 10+2
(i) Fifty Percent (50\%) for General Category Candidates, and
(ii) Forty Five Percent (45\%) for SC/ST/OBC/PWD.
(C) The candidate must have passed the qualifying examination on the date of his/her admission.
(d) Result of qualifying examination (10+2) shall be submitted by the candidate at the time of admission, failing which candidate shall be ineliglble for admission to the Course.
Other eligibility conditions will be as per the Rules of CLAT-2012

## B. INTAKE AND RESERVATIONS

The selection shall strictly be on the basis of merit as determined by the Common Law Admission Test 2012 subject to the Reservations as per Bihar (In Admission in Educational Institutions) Reservation Act 2003 (Bihar Act 16 of 2003) besides other rules. They are as follows:

## The National University of Advanced Legal Studies, Kochi

The National University of Advanced Legal Studies (NUALS) was established by Act 27 of 2005 of the Kerala State Legislature. By the same Act, the National Institute for Advanced Legal Studies (NIALS) established by the Bar Council of Kerala in 2002 merged with the NUALS.
The Chlef Justice of India is the Visitor and the Chief Justice of Kerala, the Chancellor of NUALS. In 2008, an amendment streamlined the powers and functions of the authoritles of the University and ensured the active involvement of the Government of Kerala.

Besides the subjects identifled by the Bar Councll of India for the Five Year B.A. L.B. (Hons.) degree, NUALS envisages such courses on frontier areas of law as maritime transactions, psychological medicine and law, media and telecommunications law, forensic science, history of statutory presumptions and descriptive statistics.
In addition to B.A., LL. B. (Hons.) Degree Course, the University is also offering LL.M. Degree Course in Constitutional and Administrative Law and Intemational Trade Law, Post-graduate Diploma Courses in Medical Law and Ethics and Cyber Laws and a Certificate Course in Banking Law. The University also provides facilities for research in law both full-time and part-time.
The NUALS teaching pedagogy is non-conventional with a combination of various methods of studying law with emphasis on student centered education. Choice based Credit and Semester system is introduced from the academic year 2009-10.
The NUALS Law Joumal, managed by the students, brings into focus of the legal world, some of the excellent project findings. The NUALS Legal Ald Clinic organizes awareness and outreach programmes and initiates the students to render legal advice and counselling.

The special lectures periodically delivered by eminent judges, distinguished jurists and reputed visiting fellows attract enlightened audience to the NUALS campus providing opportunity for more academic and intellectual discourses. Shri. P. C. Chacko,

Member of Parliament and Chairman of the Joint Parliamentary Committee, Prof. (Dr.) Upendra Baxi, Prof. Wemer Mensd, London University, Prof. Malcolm Joyce, Macquarle Universty, Australia, Prof. M. The NUALS Campus is situated in a 10 acre plot at Kinfra Hi-Tech Park at Kalamassery, Kochi, the industrial capital of Kerala and the seat of the Kerala High Court. At present the Academic Block, Hostels for Boys and Girls, Amenitles Centre and Faculty Apartments are operational. The construction of the Administrative Block and Library Block, with assistance from the UGC and the State Govemment, is in progress.

T. R. Raman Pillal Memorial Endowment Gold Medal for the best student in Criminal Law and Procedure and the PTA Gold Medal for the second rank holder in the B.A. Ш.B. (Hons.) Degree Examination and Barrister M.K. Nambiyar Memorial Endowrnent Gold Medal in public law and N.A. Palkhivala Memorial Gold Medal for Ш.M. are illustrations.
The M.K. Nambiyar Memorial Endowment will help meritorious, but economically weak students to complete their education by offering full or partial waiver of fees, support students to take part in international moot court competitions and organise annual lectures.
NUALS students have won laurels in moot court, debate, essay writing and quiz competitions at national and intermational levels.

## FIVE YEAR INTEGRATED B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) <br> DEGREE COURSE (CREDIT \& SEMESTER) <br> ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Admission to the B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) degree course shall be based on the performance in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT).
a) The candidate for CLAT shall have passed the Higher Secondary Certificate examination (10+2) or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto with $50 \%$ marks.
b) Exemption upto $5 \%$ from the requirement of the minimum of $50 \%$ for the qualifying examination is given to the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes (SC/ST), Persons With Disability (PWD) and candidates belonging to Backward and Other Backward Classes/ Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (declared as such in the State of Kerala). These categories are allowed to apply for CLAT if they do have not less than $45 \%$ marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
c) The candidate shall not have completed 20 years of age as on 1st July, 2012. However, candidates belonging to SC/ST (declared eligible for reservation in the State of Kerala) and Persons with Disability (PWD) shall not have completed 22 years of age as on 1st July, 2012.
d) Students who are appearing for the qualifying examination are allowed to appear for CLAT. However, they should submit the results of the qualifying examination at the time of admission. If they do not do so, the candidates shall be considered ineligible.

Seats reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes shall be interchangeable. In case sufficient candidates are not available for the seats reserved for Backward and Other Backward Classes/ Socially and Educationally Backward Classes or Persons with Disability (PWD), such seats shall be filled up under State Mert Quota and the seats unavailed by the SC/ST candidates will be filled by Other Eligible Communitles (OEC) Candidates. Candidates seeking admission against seats reserved for State Merit Quota shall produce 'Nativity Certficate' as prescribed by the Government of Kerala for admission to professional courses in the State.
Candidates seeking admission in the State Merit Quota and against the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, shall be required to submitt the required detalis to the University in the prescribed format after the publication of the CLAT 2012 Rank list.

## CONJOINT LL.M-Ph.D DEGREE PROGRAMME

The LL.M-Ph.D. Joint Degree Program is in conjunction with specialized legal research leading to a doctorate degree in law. This combination of degrees is particularly intended for law graduates who plan to acquire advanced and specialized training in the field of Law and other disciplines, preparing them for careers in academia (in both law schools and other departments), government and policymaking. ## About the University

The National Law University and Judicial Acadermy, Assam (NLUJA) has been established by the Government of Assam by way of enactment of the National Law School and Judiclal Academy, Assam Act, 2009 (Act No. 25 of 2009 - The Act is under a proposed amendment and the word 'School' is being substituted by the word 'University'). It is going to be a torchbearer in the field of legal education and research in the country. NLUJAis the youngest member in the farnily of the fourteen National Law Schools and Universities established across the country. Hon'ble, the Chief Justice of Gauhati High Court is the President (Chancellor) of the Law School. NLUJA is located at Guwahati, the capital city of Assam. Though temporarily it is housed in the NEJOTI Building in Ulubari area, its permanent campus is coming up at Amingaon (near the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Guwahati) in about a year's time.

## The Infrastructure

## The Under-Graduate Programme:

## B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.)

## Five Years Integrated Course

NLUJA offers B.A.,LL.B. (Hons.) Five Years Integrated Programme whereunder Socíal Sciences subjects like Economics, English, History, Political Science, Psychology, Public Administration and Sociology are integrated with law subjects in the first two years of study. However, from third year, the course curriculum primarily comprises of law subjects. All subjects are compulsory in the first three years of study. However, in the fourth and fifth years, students are offered optional subjects in the form of five different streams, namely, Business and Intellectual Property Law; Constitutional Law and Administrative Law; Consumer Protection and Environmental Law; Criminal Law and Criminology; and International Law and Human Rights.
NLUJA follows the Semester System. The entire Five-Year Course Is divided Into ten semesters, that is, there are two semesters in each academic year. The teaching methodology includes extensive and Intensive class room teaching. Emphasis is laid on participative and interactive method of teaching and learning. The Course includes classroom assignments, seminars and project work relating to each subject. The University follows a multidisciplinary and a wholesome approach in teaching and research. Each student is given and individual attention thereby enabling them as well as facilitating them to choose the subjects/options of their choice that could later help them in planning for their future career.

## Eligiblity for Admission

NLUJA shall strictly follow the admission criteria laid down by the CLAT. Accordingly, the admission shall exclusively be based on the performance of the candidate in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). However, in order to qualify for admission, the candidate:

1. Should have passed $10+2$ examination or its equivalent with minimum 50\% marks in the aggregate ( $45 \%$ marks in case of SC/ST/Persons with Disabilities).
2. Should be below 20 years of age as on 1st July 2011 (22 years in case of SC/ST and in case of Persons with Disabilities).
3. The candidates appearing in or awaiting results of the qualifying examination respectively being held in March/ April 2012 may also apply and appear for the CLAT provisionally subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed percentage of marks at the time of their interview/ counselling.
4. The candidature of:
a. those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and fail to produce result on the date of counselling, and
b. those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject

(Our staff with the Hon'ble Cfiancelor Mr. Justice Madan B. Lokur) in the qualifying examination, shall be cancelled and the subsequent securing of qualifying marks, shall not be considered at any stage.
