Question 1:


Discuss in pairs and answer each question below in a short paragraph (30 – 40 words).

Question 3:

Discuss in groups and answer the following questions in two or three paragraphs (100 - 150 words)

Q. of the three, Jerome, George and Harris, who do you think is the best or worst packer?

Support your answer with details from the text.

A. According to the text, none of the three friends, Jerome, George and Harris were proficient in packing. Although Jerome took pride in his packing skills, he forgot to pack the boots, could not remember if he had packed his toothbrush, and accidentally packed his tobacco-pouch. Similarly George and Harris were clumsy while packing the food hampers. They started by breaking a cup. Then, they squashed on a banana and trod on the butter. They put things behind them, and could not find them. Thus Jerome was a better packer.

Q. How did Montmorency 'contribute' to the packing?

A. Montmorency was a dog who according to Jerome was very irritating and an obstruction. It came and sat down on things about to be packed. He "contributed" in the following way:

However, they turned out to be even worse at packing, while the narrator simply sits back and watches them make a mess of everything. They squashed on a banana and trod on the butter. They put things behind them, and could not find them.

Things became more amusing when, Montmorency, a dog enters the picture.

- The narrator made things more amusing by including "insightful" comments. He compares the things he unpacked for finding his toothbrush to the same state of chaos that existed when the world was created.
- When George and Harry trod on butter, the narrator says that he had never seen anyone do more with one-and-two pence worth of butter.

• The narrator describes how Montmorency killed three "lemons" by getting into the hamper before Harris could land a frying pan on it.
